Question: "What does it mean to mount up with wings like eagles?"

Answer: The phrase *mount up with wings like eagles* can be found at the end of [Isaiah 40](#), in verse 31, "But they who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint" .

During Isaiah's lifetime, the dispirited nation of Israel suffered a period of great distress politically as oppressive Assyrian powers invaded and conquered their lands. Isaiah chapters 40-48 contain promises of redemption and deliverance from the suffering. That section of the book starts with the words "Comfort, comfort ye my people, saith your God" (Isaiah 40:1). Israel had nearly given up hope, thinking God had abandoned them, yet Isaiah drives his point home in Isaiah 40:27-31, "Why sayest thou, O Jacob, and speakest, O Israel, 'My way is hid from the LORD, and my judgment is passed over from my God'? Hast thou not known? Hast thou not heard? That the everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth. fainteth not, neither is He weary? There is no searching of His understanding. . He giveth power to the faint, and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall utterly fall: but they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint".

Ancient Hebrew culture revered eagles as mighty warriors that also cared fiercely for their young. Eagles carry their eaglets to safety, away from the threat of predators. Eagles are also known for their strength and courage in dangerous, turbulent weather, soaring above storm clouds and to safety. *Eagles' wings* was a figure of speech commonly used to attribute these fine

characteristics to a person. The Lord references eagles' wings in Exodus 19:1-6, which is a recollection of how God delivered Israel from the Egyptians. In this passage, the Lord gives Moses a message for His people: "Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings and brought you unto myself. Now therefore, if you will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine. (verses 4-5).

The prophet Isaiah uses *wings like eagles* in the same way, attributing the great characteristics of eagles to those who remain faithful to God and look forward to their heavenly reward. The phrase *mount up* is a translation of the Hebrew word *'alah*, which means "to go up, ascend, to go up over a boundary." Isaiah is communicating the promise that God will provide renewed strength and courage to overcome obstacles, if Israel would only have patience and trust in the Lord's sovereign timing.

Upon reading Isaiah's words, perhaps Israel recalled what God had said to them long ago as they fled Egypt, about how the Lord had delivered them "on eagles' wings" with His great strength and power. Isaiah tells them that they, too, could have access to such deliverance. If they remained faithful to God, they would soar.

Christians today can apply the principle of Isaiah 40:31 by trusting in God's sovereignty and waiting faithfully for Him. "We do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day" (2 Corinthians 4:16). God in His grace will provide power, strength, and courage to the weary, weak, and downtrodden when they are willing to be patient and wait on Him. God will cause us to mount up on eagles' wings.

Reese's Layered Rice Krispy Treats

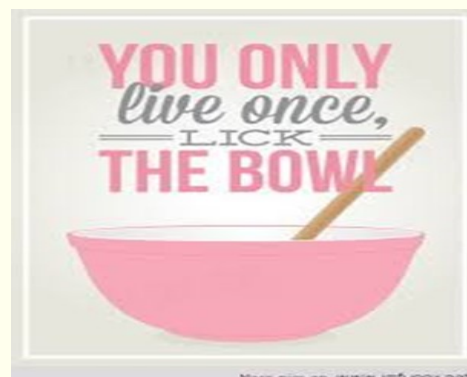
Ingredients:

Cooking spray, for pan
 5 tbsp. butter
 1 (10-oz.) bag marshmallows
 1/2 c. smooth peanut butter
 Pinch kosher salt
 6 c. Rice Krispies Cereal
 12 Reese's peanut butter cups (6 packages)
 1/4 c. melted peanut butter, for garnish
 1/4 c. melted chocolate, for garnish



Directions:

Spray a 9"-x-13" pan with cooking spray. In a large pot over medium-low heat, melt butter. Stir in marshmallows, peanut butter, and salt and stir until mixture is melted. Remove from heat. Immediately add Rice Krispies and stir with a rubber spatula (l butter or spray the spatula with oil) until combined. Working quickly, press half of mixture into an even layer in pan, then top with a layer of Reese's. Press remaining mixture over Reese's. Drizzle with melted chocolate and peanut butter, then refrigerate until cool, about 30 minutes. Slice into squares and serve. (hint, hint: oil or butter your hands)

Missionary Letters

Nathan & Tina Fritz...Cape Verde

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support. It is always a big encouragement to hear from you. Thank you so much for the many cards and notes we have received the last several weeks. Many of you have asked about a mailing address here in Cape Verde. Right now our home church is sending the occasional package to another missionary's P.O. Box in Cape Verde. It takes a little while to get here, but any cards, notes, etc. can be sent to our home sending church and they will make sure those get to us. Eventually we will have our own P.O. Box, but for the time being, this is our situation. Door to door mail does not exist in Cape Verde...In fact most streets do not have signs and very few houses have numbers...in addition to making mail an impossibility it makes finding things around town and giving directions a little difficult.

We are still engrossed in language learning. Learning Portuguese is one of the most difficult things we have tackled, and is a main focus our first few years here. I know there are many other much more challenging languages out there, but Portuguese makes our heads hurt. Pray that God would continue to give understanding and humility. I heard the other day that anyone can learn Portuguese, you just have to be willing to make 500,000 mistakes. I have not kept track of my mistakes, but I have a long way to go. I am not exactly sure how they arrived at that particular number, but it is probably about true.

In the near future we will begin tracking down paperwork for our residency visas. We are trying to decide if we will try to do this process in Praia -the capitol city, or if we will go through the long arduous process in the satellite office in Mindelo. We are told things can be a little more difficult in the main office. If we decide to go with the office in Mindelo, then we would be moving to the island of San Vicente in the next few months. Rather than confuse you with all the variables, I would ask you to pray for wisdom in this matter.

We have been greatly encouraged by the spiritual growth we have observed the ministries on the island of Santiago. The full range of false

gospels are here, and a great deal of biblical discernment needs to be practiced by the missionary as well as instilled in the people, whom the Devil is actively trying to confuse. Pray that folks would understand that truth is found in God's Word, not emotions, feelings, physical prosperity, or the teachings of men.

WE HAVE WHEELS...We are very excited that the Lord had put in our path the chance to buy a vehicle from a fellow missionary who had upgraded to a larger vehicle. It is a Nissan Pathfinder that has been overhauled from a gas engine and automatic transmission to a Toyota diesel engine and standard transmission. While this wasn't an expense we "planned" to have our first few years overseas we determined after living here a few months that a vehicle was more of a necessity than we had thought. So after praying for a while we decided to take the opportunity when it arose and used funds we had saved up for possibly shipping a container within the year. We thank the Lord for this blessing, and the opportunity to get out among the people a little more.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers.

Thank you for continuing to pray for us and the Lord's will for us. We leave this weekend for our next survey trip to South Wales, looking at the coal mining areas which had strong churches during, the Welsh revivals, but today lack good gospel preaching churches. Our friends, Rick and Jaime Owens are in Cardiff, South Wales so I will be preaching in their Church in Grangetown all day Sunday and on Wednesday as well.

Our time in Holywell has ended with the Campbell's return the first week of July. I preached for the last scheduled time on Sunday the 8th but continue to attend there unless we are preaching elsewhere. From May to the end of July, I was still able to preach twenty times, in spite of not having our own ministry. So, the Lord is keeping us busy as we look for the next chapter in our Welsh ministry.

Dixie really enjoyed teaching the children in Holywell. She is really good with teaching children (as well as teens) and so she had a good time doing crafts and teaching them an easy lesson as well. Many of the people in the church commented on how good she was with the children and the children seemed to enjoy her as well.

The weather has been amazing over the last six weeks — we have had seventy-degree temperatures, getting close to eighty-degrees. The sun has shined most of the time, but the greenery of Wales is suffering. We finally had some rain last week and it is starting to green everything up again.

We continue to be encouraged by what the Lord is doing in many good churches in North and Mid-Wales. Continue to pray for as we seek the Lord's will in the next part of our lives here in Wales. We are amazed at how God blesses and continues to help us. We are thankful for each one of you as you pray for us as well as those of you that give to our ministry in Wales! God is so good to us and it is wonderful to watch Him take care of us. Thank you for having a part in our ministry and for caring about the people of Wales!

Bill & Quessie Harvey...Mexico

We have always seen the importance of working with children. In Cd. Mante we had the double task of starting the Bible Baptist Church and training workers in the Bible Institute, How God blessed and as our student body grew on Saturdays we were able to send the students to teach children's classes in the homes of the families that attended the church, Many of the children who were won to Christ in those days are now adults serving in the church, Some of these kids later surrendered to full time service and are new pastors and missionaries. We saw 12 such classes established with attendance of several hundred kids. It is a joy to look back *and* see how God used and blessed this activity. Many of our churches in Mexico are conducting their Daily Vacation Bible schools this week and we trust with good results.

In Cd. Mante and other cities nearby, our churches have reported a good attendance with many coming to know Christ. These churches reported 1,247 saved and 332 baptized for the last 3 months. Here in Reynosa Bro. Antonio reports God's blessings also. During the last 3 months the average attendance was 125 and 16 people came to know the Lord as Savior. We request prayer for all our churches in Reynosa. We have six of our pastors and their wives who labor in this troubled city. We were able to give Bro. Antonio some help to get a parsonage ready to be occupied. We are grateful to God for his protection for them.

We requested prayer for our camps in our last letter. We appreciated those who prayed. The camps this year were down in attendance. The attendance was 126 and there were 18 decisions for the Lord. Two surrendered to study in the Bible Institute. In the intermediate camp there were 85 in attendance and 15 dedicated their lives to the Lord, The churches were not as enthused about sending young people to camp as they were in other years. Bro. Jorge Hernandez from Villa Hermosa, Tabasco sent a picture this week of a good DVBS that he had. We were so glad when Jorge surrendered his

Chong & Rhoda Singit...India

In this devotion I continue to talk about God's presence in our life with particular emphasis on "practicing the presence of God". The simple question is how do we practice the presence of God without knowing him. The answer is we can't. If this statement is true then the first and the foremost requirement for practicing the presence of God is knowing him personally, intimately and openly. "And when God said, my presence shall go with thee, and I will give thee rest" (Exodus 33:14), God meant all of God (his power, peace, provision, protection, and presence) are accompanying Moses wherever he went. The very image of God in us was marred when Adam sinned and disobeyed God by exercising the God-given freedom of choice to disobey God. God is holy; this means he is without sin which means he is loving while at the same time just. We were separated from God by sin and no longer bear the image of God. Consequently, we no longer have God's presence in our present state.

There are other areas where the presence of God is more obvious than others. But circumstances and environments are likely to influence how we practice God's presence. Just going back to the passage, Moses' face was so radiant that the people knew Moses had been many days with his God. Today we can't spend time alone with him by spending time in reading his word, the Bible, because God magnifies his word above his name.

Shalom Academy had a good start for the school year with only two teachers needing to be replaced compared to the usual five or six. We are thankful for the staff we have as many of our teachers are committed to working with us even though they could get more money in other schools. We praise God for a smooth transition even without a headmaster (Principal). All that said, Shalom is facing a few challenges this year. Among other things, this past year's performance in the State Board Exams was disappointing and perhaps the worst in five years. Some of this may be attributed to inaction on the part of the head master. He was planning to leave the school at the end of the school year but none but

himself knew. There were no special preparatory classes for those appearing at the state board exams and as routinely done in previous years. This may have played a role in the poor performance. Whatever the reasons, this is a reminder that we cannot neglect, as the State Board Exams are the only standard by which the performance of private schools are evaluated. We don't want to stress the academic achievement in absence of spiritual health of the students, nevertheless we cannot neglect the important role the Exams play. Another setback the school faced was that the office was broken into and several thousand rupees were stolen from the office. The chances of recovering a full or even partial amount is slim to nothing. Pray for the needs that theft left a hole in. Also for the one or ones involved-that they would get right with the Lord.

The Government of India, in the Ministry of Home, initiated for us to submit financial reports for 2009, and 2010. This was already submitted some time ago but misplaced. Upon completion of this documentation, they are likely to release the frozen account so we can transfer monies again. The Ministry of Home is unpredictable, so we cannot count on their promises, but we have a God that we can appeal to. If any change needs to happen, it will come from God's people praying. We have 15 days to complete the new directives. Currently there is a strike called by several different factions within the State of Manipur and the internet has been shut down for five days. Please pray as God is bigger than any involved in the strikes and the Home Ministry.

I proposed to the Shalom Native Mission Board for the approval of purchase of land for the school and Emmanuel Baptist Church from money donated by friends of the ministry for use for structural improvement. We purchased the property of slightly more than one acre near the vicinity of the school. Please pray for wisdom as how best this property can be used for the ministry. The immediate thought is to build a dormitory for the boarding students coming from distant areas of the state. There are other considerations to look at, as how to involve the church members in actively making the property theirs as their struggle has been long and hard in having a place to call home.

Helun Kipgen, reports that, VBS at New Keithelmanbi was conducted from July 1-5 with 225 students attending. Fifty young boys and girls professed to receive Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. Greetings in Jesus name. (Unnamed) I have worked on a Gospel Tract and by God's grace I have completed it now. I prepared the gospel tract first in English and then translated it into our language (Thadou-Kuki Language). I prepared it mainly for our

community but the English tract will also be helpful to those who do not understand our language. I trust that the Gospel Tract will be very useful in spreading and sharing the gospel to my community as well as to different groups of people in Manipur and Tamu.

Clint & Jennifer Shipman...Germany

Thank you for praying for our family and the ministry God has called us to in Rottenburg. We had a baptism in the Neckar River in June. The young couple in the photo with me was baptized and they brought many family members and friends to the baptism service. We started with preaching at the church and then all 37 attendees caravanned to the river, sang songs, and the couple gave some wonderful testimonies of what God had done in their lives. Afterwards, there was a lunch at the church and a great time of fellowship. Pray for those who were present and unsaved that they will be saved after having heard the Gospel clearly presented and also pray for those that need to make some decisions in their lives regarding serving the Lord. We have an urgent prayer request for you. A few months ago our rental house was sold. The new owners want to move in ASAP so that means we have to find a new place to live. We have legally, until December 31st of this year to be out. Please be praying that we will be able to find something that will fit our family and that it will be in this immediate area. We have been diligently searching for and following every lead, no matter how small, to find something adequate but, unfortunately, to no avail. It is hard to find a house or an apartment big enough for larger families. We know God has a plan so we trust Him to provide.

Jacob and Shay, our oldest son and his wife, have surrendered as missionaries to the field of Germany! We are so excited to have them come to this much needed field. Jacob grew up here and has the language down but Shay will have to learn it. Jacob also knows; what it takes to stay here and is fully aware of the hurdles we face in Germany. He surrendered to preach years ago while attending Bible College and they have been working in ministry since he graduated in 2015. Please pray for them as they start deputation this fall, safety while traveling, meetings to be booked to present their ministry burden and that they will be able to win souls and see others surrender to do God's will in their lives.

Be a well-rounded sacrificial sacrifice as ye ought to be!

Read: 2 Samuel 24:24

24: And the king said unto Araunah, Nay; but I will surely buy it of thee at a price: neither will I offer burnt offerings unto the Lord my God of that which doth cost me nothing. So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver: David was a man who understood what it was like to give to God. David did not offer God something which was convenient and easy. David wanted to offer God something which had value. David understood God has value. God is not for our own conveniences. We are **supposed to be** a living sacrifice for God (Romans 12:1). David, being a godly man, did not offer God a blemished animal. We should be the same. When we come before God, we need to be unblemished on the inside as well as the outside (Romans 12:2). As the undershepherd of God, how are you coming before God? Blemished in thought? Blemished in deeds? Blemished with your tennis shoes, shorts, torn jeans or your casual wear? Acting like God is just a school yard bud and not the KING of kings and LORD of lords?
