



Bible Verse of the Month



1 John 3:2-3

Beloved, now we are the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be; but we know that when He shall appear, we shall be like Him as He is. And every man that hath hope in Him purifieth himself, as He is pure.

People spend their lives chasing after a name that will bring them a measure of honor or notoriety. They want to be associated with a "name" university, a "name" team, a "name" company; wear clothing with a certain "name" label; drive a "name" automobile; or marry into a certain family "name." Yet, the greatest name that anyone could possibly bear has come to us unbidden. Thus, John is exhorting his readers to remember their privileges in bearing that awesome name. Chrysostom, a fourth-century Catholic archbishop, counseled parents to give children scriptural names, urging them to tell the children stories about the person who bore that name so that, as they matured, they would have something to live up to.

Is there a paradox in what John writes? We know that in order to see God, we need to be like Him. Carnally, we think that to be like Him, we need to see Him. God says that seeing Him is not necessary, as He has chosen to conduct His purposes for man through faith in His Word. He has revealed what He is by His names and by the life of Jesus Christ. By faith, we can emulate Him through His Spirit. If we saw Him in the flesh, our curiosity would likely be satisfied, or we would be so overwhelmed by His perfection that we would give up. That is how

human nature works. God's way of faith is better.

Malachi 3:16 provides wise counsel befitting the times in which we live: "Then those who feared the LORD spoke to one another, and the LORD listened and heard them; so a book of remembrance was written before Him for those who fear the LORD and who meditate on His name." The people described here are pictured as meditating for the purpose of praising, imitating, and passing on their thoughts to each other. They looked for God's good hand in every area of their lives.

David exclaims in Psalm 34:1-3: "I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul shall make its boast in the LORD; the humble shall hear of it and be glad. Oh, magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt His name together."

Family Favorites

This month I'm sharing my roasted turkey recipe. I traditionally do a turkey and a meat selection for our holiday meal, but since my coma I've discovered that the meat industry has come a long way and now I can purchase a turkey breast or 2, if needed (yippee)!

I'll skip the giblet part for now. I do them for my gravy and stuffing but I'll focus on the meat here.

A tip I learned long ago is.....

.5 pound per person. I've learned to add pounds to ensure there's enough to make up take home plates for my guests and I learned with a hungry collage boy.....he graduated this year!!!

So typically for 15 people.....a 7.5 bird but I add a few to 9 lbs. in the past that way he can have his midnight feeding plus a full leftover basket to take with him plus I bake him a pumpkin pie (yes, I spoil him) to take with him. He graduated this year so I won't need to worry about his leftovers.....I can still plan on his midnight feeding the following days though, so I'll still add 2 pounds.

Set the oven to 325° F. Set the rack in the lowest position.

Place the turkey in a roasting pan and liberally rub the skin with softened butter. Add salt and pepper and do a Julia Child impersonation: lift your hand high and let it rain salt and pepper, smile, hum jingle bells, be happy. It makes a difference on the taste; that's one of my secret ingredients.....shhhhh shhhhh! Cover with foil.

Place the turkey and pan on lowered rack in the oven, add 2 cups of turkey stock to the bottom of pan.

Every 30 minutes baste with juices from the bottom of pan. When the juices evaporate add more stock, making sure there is 1 to 2 cups in the pan at all times.....it keeps the meat moist.

Remove the foil for the last 30 minutes to allow it to crisp.

Make sure it's roasted to ensure the meat is properly cooked.

Raw turkey can and will ruin any event.

Call your carver to do their job.... my father carved at all our family gatherings. With his passing my son inherited Dad's good carving knife and sharpener and with that went the responsibility to Nick.

As Julia would say Bon Appetit.

Let me tell you a true story. In 1986, in the first church that we started, we had a young lady named Lisa in the Church. Lisa became burdened for a friend and workmate named, Sue. Sue started coming to our church and came faithfully for eight months, and then was gloriously saved. Sue began to grow and just as Dixie started teaching her to be a Sunday School teacher, God moved her to Manchester, England, because of her work.

In the Manchester area, Sue continued to be faithful in church and joined Bible Baptist in Bury, Manchester. She became involved in the church, met Bob from her work and she began to take him to church. Eventually, Bob was saved, and Sue and Bob were married. They had two girls, whom they took to church and both of them were saved as well. The youngest fell in love with the Pastor's son, and the two of them were married in August. (Sue's mother was saved in our church as well.)

Before the wedding started, Lisa and her husband were there, and I said to her: "You realize that this wedding taking place in a Bible-believing Baptist Church today is all your fault." I would like to begin by thanking everyone who has given to our building fund. I have personally tried to thank every church and individual. However, if I have inadvertently failed to get a personal thank you note to you, and you have given, please forgive the oversight, and know that the church and I are deeply and sincerely grateful.

As you already know, we had until the end of August to raise money for our building fund, that would be matched dollar for dollar up to \$50,000. God blessed us with over \$33,000 being given, and our church was rejoicing in the goodness of God! At the end of August, the anonymous donor said we could have until the end of the year to raise the remainder of the \$50,000. God has already sent in a couple thousand more dollars. So, we are only about \$15,000.00 shy of our goal. We stand amazed at God's provision.

It appears that God has given us favor with at least one of the officials in the Yarmouth Town Office. I recently sat down with a gentleman who went over our land options, and he was incredibly helpful in our search for land. We are still looking and praying, and now we have someone in the Town Office who is also helping with our search. We know God will open the appropriate doors and meet our church's need for land at the right time and in the best location.

We have had a busy summer and have enjoyed giving out the gospel on the street and distributing Bibles door to door. We had the youth group from First Baptist Church of Atoka, TN help us evangelize at the Yarmouth Clam Festival and also in Freeport outside of L.L.Bean's flagship store. Thousands of gospel tracts were distributed, and our church was greatly encouraged by their visit.

There are several ministry opportunities that we are praying about for the coming year. Please pray that God will give us much wisdom. We don't want to get ahead of him, but we certainly do not want to be lagging behind.

Thank you for your consistent prayers and financial support. You are making an eternal difference.

Mshama & Martha Kinyonga...Tanzania

Greetings from Morogoro, Tanzania. We know that it is now the fall season in the States and have enjoyed seeing pictures of the leaves changing. We are entering our summer season, so we are embracing the end of the coolness and heading into the hot.

These months here at GBC have been good. We have been faithful in the little things, which has led to consistent growth. Teaching, preaching, baptism, and soul winning. We are helping and guiding folks and praying that they make the right decisions. I am always grateful for the folks God brings to GBC so we can make a difference. We have been averaging 300-plus on Sundays and 120 on Wednesdays. Thank you to all who have prayed for and supported us. This is just as much your ministry and influence as it is ours.

On one of the Saturdays, we went soul winning in an area called Bigwa. We had over 85 people come out that day, and 9 people trusted Christ. Sometimes you wonder whatever happens to the tracts you leave. The very next day, which was Sunday morning, I got a phone call at 7:00 from 2 teenagers who were ready and want to be picked up. Then at 8:30 that same morning when we were about to leave, a little boy was ready and waiting at his gate to go to church. You just never know the influence you are having; don't quit the small stuff.

We have had three funerals these past two months: 90-year-old Mama Robert, 45-year-old Felix, and 57-year-old Ephraimu. It makes us realize how precious life is and how much we need to take advantage of the influence that we have on people. To our knowledge, they had all accepted Christ as their personal Saviour. Many of our folks chipped in and helped dig the graves, cook, and help with the service—just working together so things would go smoothly. As you know, death is unexpected. So many of our folks were willing to change their schedules to help show support. I'm proud of our church members.

We had our 3rd Annual Bike Race and Family Day. We had over 30 men and 23 women in the competition. We had the race in the morning while the weather was still cool, and in the afternoon, we played "camp-like" games. It was good fellowship and a time where everyone could get involved and have fun as a family.

We are grateful that we can inform you of what is going on here. We appreciate your love for us and all the notes that we get. They are a great encouragement to us. We pray for your ministries as well, that God will give a great increase and that fun and excitement will be present.

Nathan & Tina Fritz-Cape Verde

Another few months have come and gone here in Cape Verde. We are grateful for the Lord's care, protection and provision. We are in the middle of "rainy" season, which means we have had a few good rains. In fact we experienced tropical storm Florence before she headed to the east coast of the United States. The island is quite a bit greener with the rain, and I am sure the reservoirs are nice and full. Along with the rain comes some sickness (from mold, allergies and dirty standing water in the streets) as well as a lot of bugs come with the wetter conditions.

We have decided to extend our stay in the capital city. Our language learning situation here is very good, and we have good ministry opportunities as we continue to learn. Our Portuguese tutor has begun teaching in the public school again, she wants to continue teaching us as well. She said she enjoys seeing our family when she comes to the house for classes. She is a good teacher and we hope her schedule does not become too hectic over the next several months. I was able to take an intense two week Kriolu language class in August. Cape Verdean Creole, or "Kriolu" is a sort of simplified Portuguese. It was encouraging to understand a little more of the chatter out on the streets, as the people primarily speak Kriolu to each other.

I began teaching a "Panoramic Bible Study" class in a small seminary. The class is a basic overview of scripture, focusing on the whole story of God's Word. The "Seminario Batista de Teologia" has been around for several years, and we are honored to be a small part of this needed work. The training of national leadership is vital to the work of God going forward in Cape Verde and around the world! Pray for the three students currently enrolled and a fourth that is on His way from the country of Guinea-Bissau. This has also been a great language learning opportunity for me.

We have also just moved to a different apartment in an area of the city called "Cidadela." It is a developing part of the city, with lots of construction and empty lots around. We are grateful for the wide open spaces for the kids to play. Our new apartment is unfurnished and we are slowly acquiring all the furnishings. It is a much quieter and cheaper place to live. We are a little more prone to power outages and running our water tank dry. Our water is delivered in a tanker truck every week. We appreciate your prayers as we begin the residency visa process. There is expense, time, and paperwork involved. Pray that God would continue to give us opportunities to serve Him.

Greetings from Idaho! I would like to begin this letter with my sincerest, "Thank you," for your prayers and support for our family and the church plant in Teton County, Idaho. We are reminded daily that much of the West is a stronghold of Satan. September was harvest season here. What a reminder that we need to sow and reap, work and pray, while we still have time. Teton County is a place that has never had a committed Independent Baptist Church. It is a difficult field, but we know that we serve a God of miracles and provision. Your prayers and support go a long way to seeing this area planted with the gospel. Thank you.

On September 9, we celebrated the second anniversary of Grandview Baptist Church. The Lord blessed us with 51 people in attendance! After a summer of ups and downs, this was a tremendous encouragement to us. One family that we are asking prayer for is the Penfold family. Wyatt is pretty high up in the Mormon church, but has come to our first service, first anniversary service, and also came to our second anniversary service! He, his wife, Valerie, and his family stayed for the morning service, lunch, and our afternoon charter service in spite of the calls from his bishop who was wondering where he was. We do not know how God is working in their hearts, but we beg for your prayers for his and his wife's salvation. We are so thankful for the work God has done so far in this valley, but we are longing to see more souls saved. Please pray with us!

During our Vacation Bible School, we started picking up a little Hispanic boy named Jeffrey. Jeffrey and his two little sisters ride the church van pretty regularly. Two Sundays ago, Jeffrey and his sisters drove into church with their father, Jose. He stayed for the morning service and seemed to really appreciate the preaching. I visited him this week with a Hispanic man from our sending church. We talked for close to an hour. He is really searching for the truth in the Word of God. Please pray that the Holy Spirit would show him the simple truth of salvation, and that he would not be mixed-up by these other religious teachings.

One more prayer request is for our Kids' Club starting the beginning of November. We had a great turnout last year and are looking forward to another great year! Please pray for an 11-year-old girl named Allison. She is a sweet girl who faithfully rides the church van every Sunday, but she has not yet accepted the Lord as her Savior.

Please pray that Allison will see the need of salvation very soon.
Once again, thank you for your love and support.

Dan & Debbie Morris...Mexico

We praise God that our Radio Station is up and running again with 24 hours a day preaching, teaching, stories and music.

After demolishing the main school building and temporarily restoring one strip of rooms for dormitories, we were ready for the opening of the expanded Chiapas Baptist Bible Institute. For years I had been training many pastors in a personal "Paul-Timothy" style. Many excellent, godly pastors were trained in that style and I still continue the same method (now called the Extension Institute) with married men. I was limited, however, to being able to personally train up to eight or nine men at a time, and the process took many years to achieve the goal.

The purpose of the "full-course" edition of the Bible College is to be able to receive a much greater number of students to train for the ministry. It also makes it possible to train young women for the very important areas of ministry that they fulfill.

On September 2, we opened with a Pastors Fellowship week with preaching focused on faithful work in the ministry. The final count of students is 10 living in the dormitories, six living off-campus, and five remaining in the Extension Institute. This makes a total of 21 men and women who are now being trained for the ministry through the Chiapas Baptist Bible Institute.

Amazingly, all of the students came from our main church in Tuxtla and from our mission in Berriozabal. As God works in the hearts of people in other-churches in this southern region of Mexico, it is probable that this number will greatly increase. Please have a prayer in your hearts for these pioneering students and for the-powerful hand of God on this ministry.

Of course, this is still in a temporary stage and the actual campus remains to be built. The funds promised for this project are now up to \$15,000 and by faith we will soon begin building the permanent dormitories. The complex will someday include all of the rooms, dormitories, and offices of the college.

It will also include classrooms for a Christian School open to the public and, finally classrooms for University level career courses. The first phase will cost around \$50,000, and the final cost of the campus (buildings only) will be about \$300,000.

Whatever God may provide for you to have a part in this project will be a great blessing to this country


